A walk around the three Barry Island beaches with a commentary from geologist Professor Maurice Tucker (University of Bristol). Barry Island was a beach in Triassic times (200 million years ago), but on the shores of a lake rather than the sea, under an arid climate. Come and find out more about this well-known seaside location. We will see ancient screes, cliffs, gypsum and fossils. Note Only 25 places available. This is a stop and talk walk.
